JEA plans to phase-out the subject wastewater treatment plant from service as soon as reasonably feasible, due to the condition of the facility and the lower cost of treating the Beacon Hills wastewater flow at the Arlington East Regional Water Reclamation Facility.

S E W E R

JEA's current Facility Master Plan and Five Year Capital Improvement Program contain projects which will allow the phase-out of the subject wastewater facility by September 30th, 2007. These projects include a pump station at the existing plant site, a new off site Master Sewage Pump Station and major Force Main improvements.

Implementation of these scheduled projects is subject to ongoing budget priorities and approval of JEA's Fiscal Year 2006 and Fiscal Year 2007 capital budgets by the JEA Board and the Jacksonville City Council. In addition, a significant portion of the Force Main improvements are in the Right-of-Way of the Wonderwood Expressway and JEA's project schedule is contingent upon the Jacksonville Transportation Authority adhering to their current project schedule for the Expressway.

I looked at our 10 year planning document today, and here is the current plan for Beacon Hills. In order to phase out Beacon Hills plant, we will have to construct a Master Pumping Station. The current schedule is to construct that station (Holly Oaks MPS) by the end of 2009. Then Beacon Hills could be de-commissioned in 2010, and that is the current plan.

As you know, having worked in city government years ago, plans and budgets are subject to change, so the dates above may move over time. Hope this helps.
